

One third of Australia's homeless are children.

Today in South Australia, almost 1 in 70 people are struggling to find a safe place to call home. A third of these are children. Housing stress, unemployment, family breakdown, violence and mental health issues are key factors. Each year Baptist Care's homelessness services provide more than 34,000 nutritious meals. These go hand in hand with a range of other vital support services supporting at-risk and vulnerable people to have access to the basics.

Food and relief.

Fighting hunger in Adelaide is a cause very close to our hearts. Our homelessness services, situated in Millers Court, Adelaide offer a safe place to come for food, shelter, support, advocacy and referrals. Our pantry is stocked with non-perishable food items, thanks to generous donors and Emergency Financial Assistance government grants. We provide more than 1,500 emergency relief parcels every year.

Health and wellbeing.

Without a home, you cannot prepare a meal, have a shower or clean your clothes. If you can't wash yourself or your clothes you smell and people avoid being with you. Most of the time you are simply ignored. Anyone who comes to our WestCare Centre is welcome. Our facilities provide dignity and are offered with respect. There is no charge for those unable to pay.

Support and accommodation.

Finding the right sort of support when you're homeless can be hard. We offer a range of programs that can help.

We can help you find the most appropriate services to meet your needs, even if we don't provide them ourselves. We can also provide case management services as needed.

Helping young people.

Young South Australians struggling with life have been coming to us for help for more than 20 years. Many are working through complex issues of family breakdowns, domestic violence, homelessness, drug addiction and more.

Our Inner Southern Youth Homelessness Service provides support to those aged 15 - 25 who are experiencing homelessness or are at risk of homelessness. Our youth-specific case workers help individuals overcome the obstacles preventing them from moving forward

We offer:

Crisis Support - 24 hour supported residential accommodation service with a comprehensive range of personal supports

Support to successfully move to independent housing - If you are ready to be more independent, we can offer a place in a semi-supported unit. You still receive all the support you need - with the clear aim of equipping you to be able to live on your own. This program operates across the City of Marion, the City of Holdfast Bay and the City of Mitcham.

Aboriginal support.

In our **Eastern Adelaide Aboriginal Specific Homelessness program**, we work with Aboriginal men and women who are homeless or at risk of homelessness and help them find and maintain long term stable housing.

We use Aboriginal-specific case management workers to help identify the barriers and challenges that are preventing an individual from finding a long term home. We assess each person's accommodation and support needs and try to find solutions. We work in partnership with a range of Community Housing Organisations to achieve this.
