## Independence and wellbeing.

Our Elders Program supports men and women of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Island descent, residing in the Southern and Eastern Metropolitan areas of Adelaide. Specifically, we work with people over 50 years old, who are living in the community and are aged and frail.

We also work with women over 18 years, who are living with a moderate; severe or profound disability and/or experiencing social isolation. The program provides:

- Counselling, information and advocacy
- Group activities such as craft groups and excursions
- Social Support including assistance with day to day tasks such as shopping and banking
- Transport including assistance to attend appointments
- Centre-based day-care

## Who we are.

Baptist Care SA provides out of home care, disability care, youth education and employment, homelessness and therapeutic support services.

Established in 1913, Baptist care SA currently has over 1,000 dedicated staff and volunteers who work tirelessly to help South Australians achieve their full potential.

## Deadly pathways.

Young people moving toward adulthood have lots of questions about who they are and what options they have in life.

Deadly Pathways is a mentoring and engagement program for Indigenous youth and is focused on promoting pride within culture and developing opportunities for the future.

Working with 16 to 24 year olds, our dedicated team aims to re-engage and support young people to participate in education to prepare for employment.

## Accommodation.

This service can only be accessed by clients referred to by Baptist Care SA via the Exceptional Needs Unit (ENU) of Disability SA.

We provide a supported accommodation service for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander men who are homeless or have experienced chronic homelessness and who have high and complex needs as assessed by the ENU.

## Homelessness support.

We work with Aboriginal men and women who are homeless or at risk of homelessness and support them to find and maintain long term stable housing.

Our Aboriginal-specific case managers work with clients to identify the barriers and challenges that are preventing them from finding long term housing solutions. We assess each person's accommodation and support needs and seek to provide them with appropriate support. To do this, we work in partnership with various Community Housing Organisations.
