COVID-19 has had a profound impact on every aspect of our lives. It has made things even more difficult for those already doing it tough, and now thousands of people who have never needed to ask for help before are struggling to feed themselves and their families.





Demand for emergency relief at our Inner City site, including the **Community Food Hub and WestCare** Centre continues to climb. A staggering 700% increase since February.1



Furthermore, 39% of hungry Australians have felt too embarrassed and ashamed

"I feel like I have failed my family. My work place went out of business during the shutdown and we all lost our jobs. JobSeeker helped keep us going for a while, but now that has been cut back, we just can't make ends meet. We put off asking for help as long as possible because we feel so ashamed." Angela³

When COVID-19 first hit in March the WestCare courtyard and dining room were forced to close and sadly remain shut. All meals are now served as takeaway.

Sharing a meal is often our clients' only social contact. Being deprived of this is particularly tough if it's the only opportunity you have each day to have a chat, but people are showing remarkable resilience. There is much camaraderie in the laneway queue each day.
